IACUC approval is required any time animals will be transferred to a DFCI lab space for any length of time. For animals on DFCI animal protocols, securing IACUC approval for transfer to a DFCI lab space can be handled in a new protocol or 3-year rewrite and by amendment with Amendment Form D.

In rare cases, investigators may wish to transfer animals from a non-DFCI animal facility to a DFCI lab space. In such cases, the following steps must be taken.

- The investigator must email a copy of the approved animal protocol from the non-DFCI animal facility to the IACUC Office (<u>dfci_iacuc@dfci.harvard.edu</u>). If transfer to the DFCI lab space is not described on that protocol and will be added by amendment, the investigator must also email a copy of the pending amendment.
- 2. The IACUC Office will pre-review the protocol and/or amendment to confirm the following details are specified. If any of these details are not specified in the protocol and/or the amendment, the IACUC Office will contact the investigator to capture them.
 - The location of the DFCI lab space
 - The specific procedures performed in that lab space
 - The names of the investigators performing the procedures*
 - Each investigator's level of proficiency with the procedures
 - The length of time animals will be held in the lab
 - If the duration is <1 hour, no further information is required.</p>
 - If the duration is >1 hour and <12 hours, it must be clearly stated how adequate food and water will be provided
 - Housing >12 hours is not permitted in DFCI lab spaces
 - * The investigators performing the procedures **must** be listed on the animal protocol from the non-DFCI animal facility and have completed that facility's animal user training
- 3. After the IACUC Office reviews the protocol and/or amendment, the Attending Veterinarian (or, in the Attending Veterinarian's absence, a member of the IACUC designated by the IACUC Chair) will review the sections of the protocol and/or amendment that describe transport to the DFCI lab space. Also, the non-DFCI animal facility must provide the Attending Veterinarian with facility health reports as they become available. (The Attending Veterinarian will contact the veterinarian at the non-DFCI animal facility about these health reports.)

If there are no further concerns, the Attending Veterinarian (or designated reviewer) can then accept the non-DFCI animal facility's approval for transport to the DFCI lab space. This will be documented in a letter to the investigator.

If there are further concerns, the Attending Veterinarian (or designated reviewer) has the authority to escalate the matter to the IACUC for Full Committee Review (FCR).
